Overview of Highlands East

The Municipality of Highlands East is located in central Ontario, Canada, and was established on January 1, 2001, through the amalgamation of the former townships of Bicroft, Cardiff, Glamorgan and Monmouth. However, the history of the area dates back much further, with Indigenous peoples inhabiting the region for thousands of years before European settlement.

The land that would become Highlands East was originally inhabited by the Michi Saagiig and Chippewa Nations. European settlement began in the early 19th century, with the arrival of fur traders, followed by settlers drawn to the area's rich natural resources, including timber, minerals, and fertile land.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, the logging industry played a significant role in the development of the region, with many sawmills and logging camps operating in the area. The arrival of the railway in the late 1800s further facilitated the extraction of timber and the transportation of goods to market.

The early settlers of Highlands East faced many challenges, including harsh winters, isolation, and limited access to services. However, the community was resilient, and over time, it grew and prospered. Agriculture also played a significant role in the local economy, with many settlers establishing farms and homesteads.

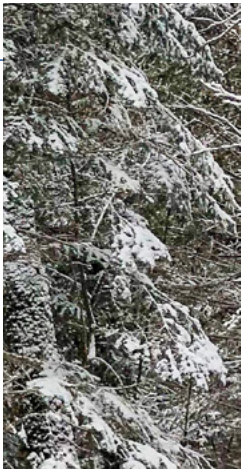


Thriving Community

Service and operational excellence is about delivering high-quality services efficiently and effectively, meeting the needs of the community while ensuring transparency, accountability, and continuous improvement.

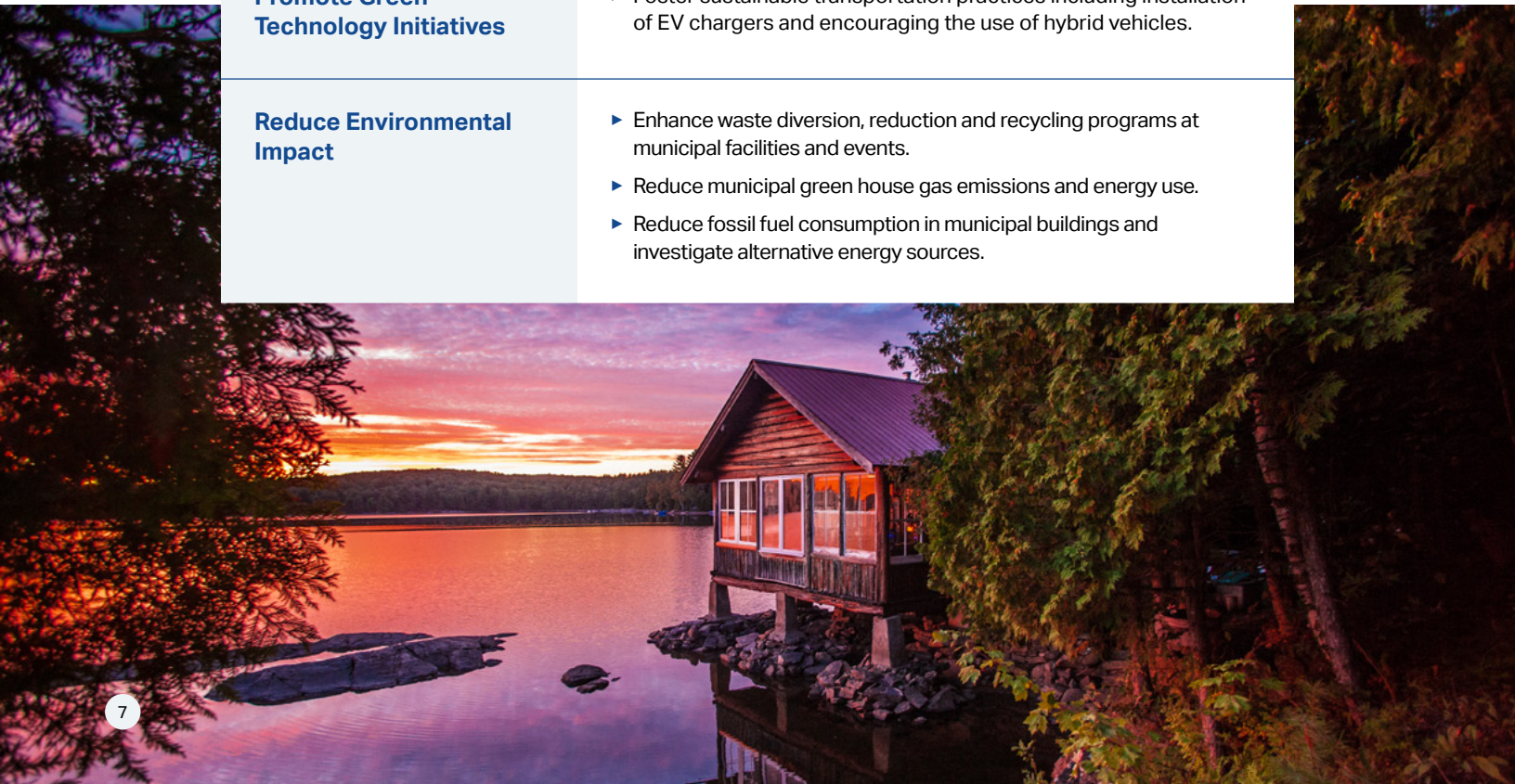

10. Are there opportunities to collaborate with community partners or organizations to enhance project outcomes and community impact?
11. What are the potential barriers or challenges to successfully completing this project, and how can they be mitigated?
12. How will the success of this project be measured and evaluated?
